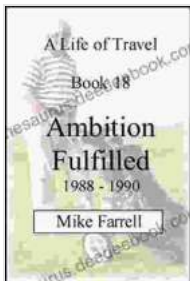


# An Ambition Fulfilled: 1988-1990 Life of Travel 18

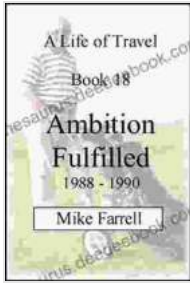
