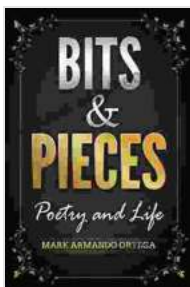

deepest emotions and aspirations, poetry can help us to better understand ourselves and our place in the world.

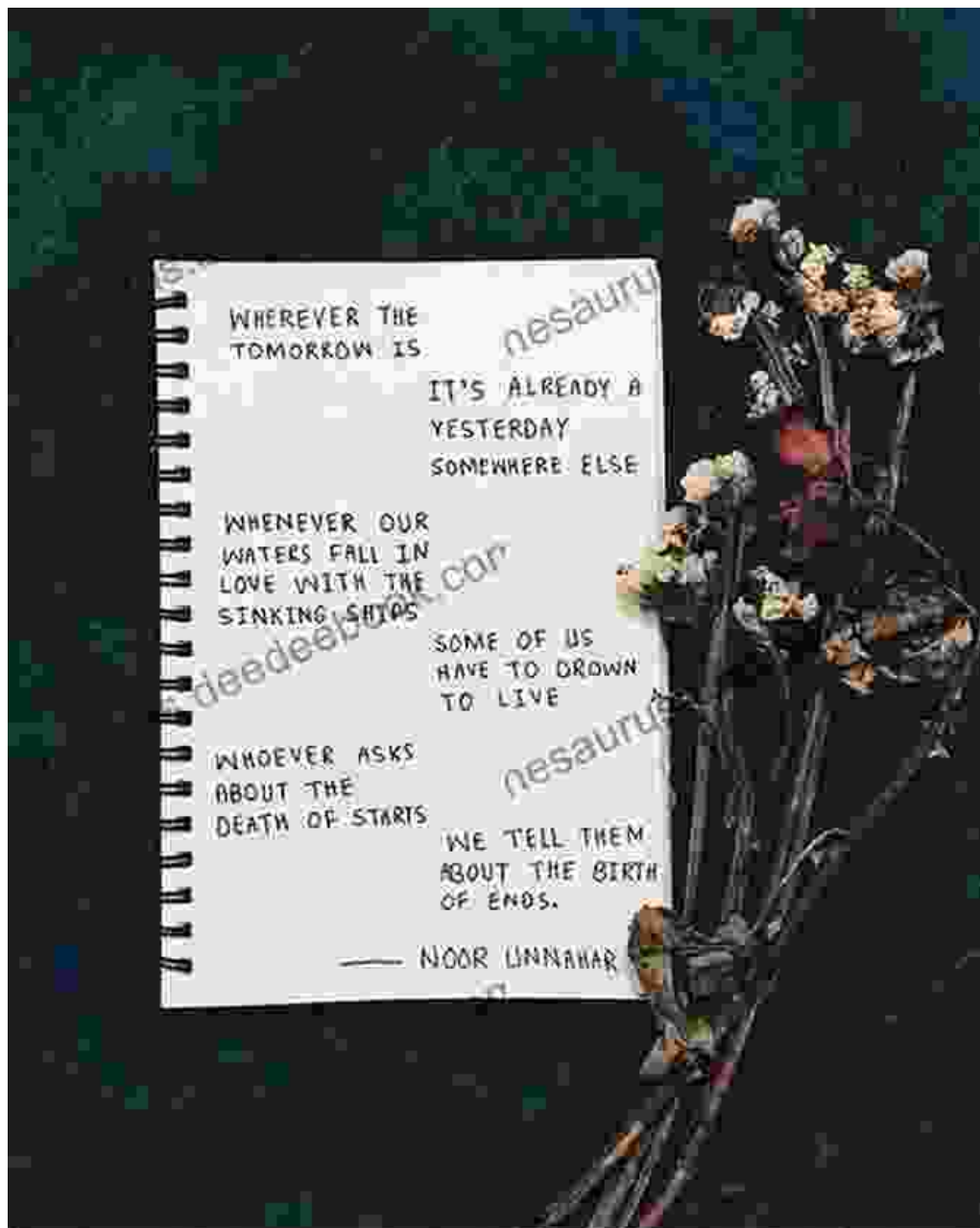

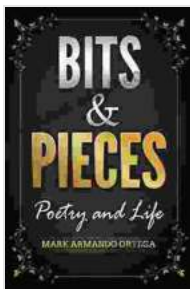

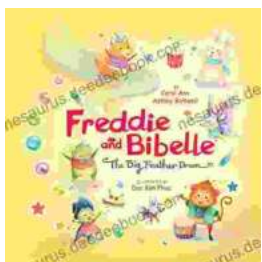
