Do they have clear and compelling goals, and are those goals mutually exclusive?



## Passion

Do they both care passionately about something that the reader can understand?



## Core Opposition

Is what they care about at the heart of their opposition?



## Relatability

Are they both likable or at least relatable to the reader?



## Strength

Is the antagonist at least as strong as the protag and just as compelling?



## External versus Interior Goals

Is there opposition between what the protagonist wants and what she needs?



## High Stakes

Are there terrible consequences if the protagonist fails?



## Sacrifice

Does the protag have to make an impossible choice to win against the antag?



## Choice between Internal and External Goals

Does she have to choose between what she wants and what she needs?



## Character and Story Arc

Does the protag change in character and circumstances?



## All Characters Real?

Do all the main characters in the book have genuine flaws and eccentricities?

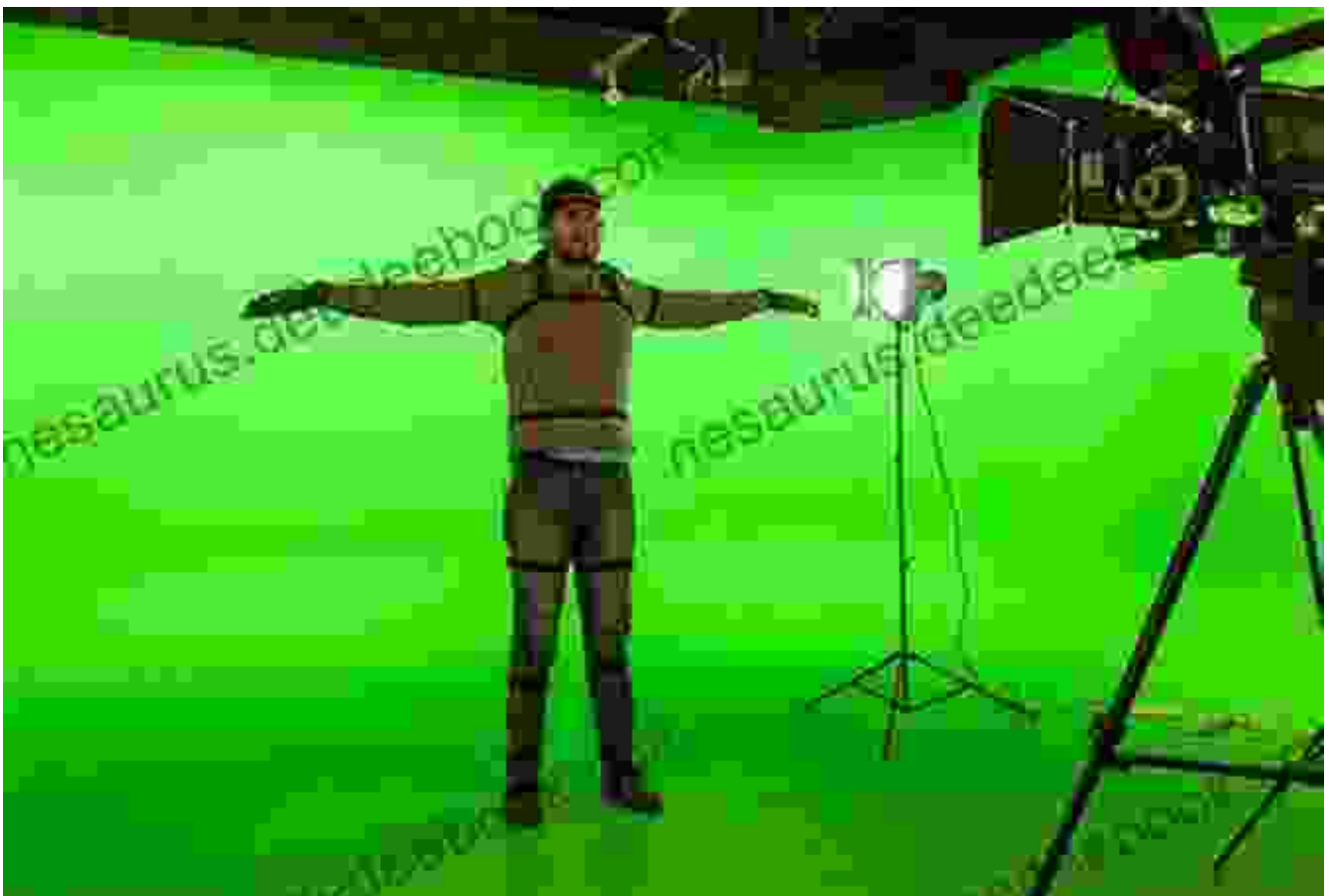

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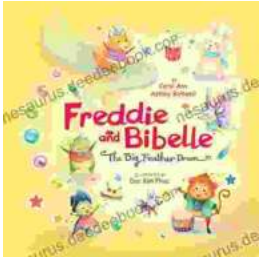
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
