





Essential Gear

Fly Rod

Tippets are the final section of line that connects your fly to the leader and should be chosen based on the size of the fish you are targeting.



Flies

The choice of flies depends on the species of fish you are targeting and the time of year. It is essential to have a variety of fly patterns on hand to match the available food sources.

Connecticut Fishing License


All anglers over the age of 16 must possess a valid Connecticut fishing license. Licenses can be purchased online or at any fishing license vendor.


